

FENCE VARIANCE GUIDELINES

FOR USE OF PROPERTY VALUE COMMITTEE

- 1. No fences will be allowed in the area between the street curb and the nearest portion of the dwelling (no front lawn fences).
- 2. Any fence must abut the dwelling at some point (no free standing fence in the middle of the lawn)
- 3. No "line fences" (one which separates property from adjacent property)
- 4. No animal kennels or runs.
- 5. No fence will be permitted which will obstruct free movement of landscape equipment.
- 6. No privacy fence more than six (6) feet in height. Decorative styles of fences may be no more than four (4) feet in height.
- 7. Only the following fence material will be permitted:
 - a. Cedar wood (similar to present privacy fences installed by original builders)
 - b. White vinyl
- 8. Fences may not be stained or painted.
- 9. Owner &/or Occupant will be responsible for maintenance of space inside any fenced portion of the property and the owner will be subject to citation for failure to comply.
- 10. Owner will be responsible for providing proof that a fence will not encroach upon adjacent property, by new, professional survey if necessary.
- 11. Finish fencing material, i.e. boards, slats, must be on the outside of the fence, causing the posts &/or horizontal supporting material to be as invisible to the public as such construction permits.
